These regulations can be found in the Guide to Safe Scouting, and the National Camping Standards as well as various federal, state, and local laws. These rules are implemented primarily for the safety of our campers and the staff. Following these cannot guarantee a good summer camp experience. The only way to ensure that you and your Scouts have a memorable camp experience is to develop a sense of purpose and enthusiasm that begins long before the packing for camp begins.

This guide sets forth many of the policies and procedures which will ensure that the camp will follow those guidelines. What this guide does not set forth is how to develop a way to share a sense of purpose with your Scouts and their parents. Additionally, there is no possible way for a leader's guide to promote the level of enthusiasm necessary for the ultimate Cub and Webelos Resident Camp experience.

To leaders who have gone to camp before, you may understand that you can explain how long the bike ride is, or how cold the polar bear swim feels, or how good the food is, and how goofy the staff sings during the campfire. But can you find words to describe that Scout who is having one of the best days of his life? It is up to you as a leader to bring that enthusiasm to your pack before they get to camp.

If you can bring that enthusiasm to a boy, then you may be able to change the world. I look forward to seeing all of you at camp this summer.

## WHO CAN COME

The answer to who can come depends on the activity. The Winnebago Council offers different levels of camping for Cub Scout and Webelos aged youth.

**Webelos and Cub Scout Resident Camp:** Three days and two nights for those going into 2<sup>nd</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade.

**Webelos Shooting Sports Weekend:** An overnight campout for those going into 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> grade with a parent or adult partner.

**Cub Scout Day Camp:** One-day activities for all ages at one of our council camps with the option an overnight camp at WSR. New Tigers are able to spend the night with their adult partners.

**Fun Days:** Day long activities which are conveniently located at parks throughout the Council.

### **Bring the Family**

The Day Camp and Fun Days are open to the whole family. However, there may not be age appropriate activities for those younger than Cub Scout age.

### **How many leaders must attend?**

Every unit must have two-deep leadership at all times and one of these leaders must be over the age of 21. There can be no more than five Scouts for every adult leader. However, a Scout may attend any activity with one adult partner.

Each Tiger Cub (those entering the 1<sup>st</sup> grade) must be accompanied by an adult partner. Tiger Cubs are not able to attend Resident Camp.

Unit leaders and adults will be responsible for the supervision and discipline of the Scouts in their units.



# WHAT TO BRING

Cub Scouts and Webelos in an overnight program will stay in one of the program areas: Calvary Fort, Gold Rush Town, Double H Ranch, Staudt Hollow, or the Hobbit Huts. Cub Scouts will sleep in a cabin, tent, or Hobbit Hut with a cot and mattress.

Adult leaders will need to bring their own tents and bedding. A limited number of tents are available at camp.

## **Trading Post**

A trading post is located at both council camps. Campers will be able to purchase snacks, drinks, camp t-shirts, souvenirs, and other scout related item.



## **WHERE TO GO**

When arriving at WSR, one leader per unit needs to check in at the Director's Lodge. The leader needs to present three copies of their roster: one for the Camp Director, one for the Health Officer, and one for the unit leader. After checking in, the leader will be directed to take the entire unit to the Health Lodge. The camp health officer will review the medical form for each scout and adult.

Any Scout coming late must sign in at the Director's Lodge, review the Health Form with the Health Officer, and arrange for a swim check. Any Scout leaving early must have a signed permission slip from a parent or guardian and must check out at the Director's Lodge.

## **HEALTH AND SAFETY INFORMATION**

### **Emergencies**

A qualified Health Officer will be on duty while camp is in session. All injuries or illness should be reported. In the case of serious injury or illness every effort will be made to contact the camper's parent. Charges for health care will be the responsibility of the Scout's family.

### **Medical Forms**

Every Scout and adult attending any of the Camp programs must have a completed Medical Form to attend camp. These forms are reviewed by the Health Officer and kept at the Health Lodge in case of an emergency. *Campers will not be allowed to participate in activities unless a Health Form is completed.* Forms may be picked up when leaving camp. If the forms are not picked up they will be destroyed.

### **Medication**

*All medication, prescription and non-prescription (yes, even Tylenol and Aspirin) is kept in the Health Lodge.* Medication must be in its original container and correctly labeled.

### **Bad Weather**

The staff will review emergency procedures with the leaders in camp on the first day at check-in. The dining hall and other buildings are available for shelter during any emergency weather conditions. The pool will close for any thunder or threat of severe weather and remain closed until severe weather has passed.



# **WHEN TO BE THERE**

## **CUB AND WEBELOS RESIDENT CAMP**

Check-in is from 8:00-9:00 on Friday morning and camp will end Sunday afternoon. Early check-in is available and campers may arrive Thursday evening after supper.

Each Scout at resident camp is encouraged to invite his whole family for the picnic lunch and the Cub Scout closing campfire following the Sunday lunch. Please contact parents ahead of time, so the staff will have enough on hand to serve everyone. Visitors will need to purchase tickets at the trading post to cover the cost of the picnic. The cost is \$4.00 for those over 12 years of age, \$3.00 for those 6-12 years of age, and free for those younger than 6.

## **WEBELOS SHOOTING SPORTS WEEKENDS**

This overnight weekend is reserved for Webelos (those going into grades 4 and 5).

Check-in is at 1:00 pm on Saturday and the program will end at approximately at 11:00 am on Sunday. Saturday supper and Sunday breakfast will be provided.

## **WHY CAMPING**

Camping is an important part of the Scouting experience. Summer camps provide opportunities for Cub Scouts to experience the outdoors, learn about nature, and discover new things about themselves. However, when your sons are at camp they may not notice all the new things they are learning, because they will be too busy having fun.

The Winnebago Council strives to provide camping opportunities for all ages of Cub Scouts. The program is designed for boys finishing their Kindergarten year up to and including those entering their fifth grade year who are looking ahead to the time when they join a Boy Scout Troop and then on to Venturing.

Each camp will have age appropriate programming specifically tailored to meet the needs of the campers. Every camp program will have its share of games, songs, crafts and outdoor fun. At both Council camps you can expect to go swimming, and shoot BB guns and archery. Winnebago Scout Reservation has pedal cars and mountain bikes while the Ingawanis Adventure Base has horses for arena rides.

## **SPECIAL NOTES**

Resident camp is for the whole pack this year. All four weekends are available for any Scout going into 2<sup>nd</sup> through 5<sup>th</sup> grade. Different activities will be provided for Cubs and Webelos.

The Day Camps at WSR will be Saturday activities, but a Scout can choose to spend the night with his adult partner. Supper and breakfast would be provided.
