

Winnebago Council 2010 Jamboree Contingent Technology Policy

Personal Media Devices

(iPods, Gameboys, CD/DVD players, etc.):

Scouts may bring Personal Media Devices for use while traveling on the bus, but they must leave them on the bus while at Jamboree. The Scouts will be responsible for securing them on the bus at their risk. This equipment should not be needed on the trip, as videos will be played on the bus.

Personal Communication Devices (**cell phones**):

Scouts may bring Personal Communication Devices with them to Jamboree with the understanding that they cannot charge them at Jamboree, and that the devices are brought along at their own risk. Phones can be shut off when not used/needed to preserve charge.

Scoutmasters recommend that Scouts bring an old phone in case they are lost or broken.

Scoutmasters will take charge of situations with both types of devices that are causing problems while the troops are away from home, with potential confiscation of equipment until our return home. The Council and the Leaders will not be responsible for lost, stolen, or broken equipment. These policies may change prior to departure, as the Leadership deems necessary.

Medication Policy

1. ALL medications must be in their ORIGINAL containers.
2. Medications in ORIGINAL containers will be stored in one quart Zip Lock bags with the name and Troop number of the Scout printed on the outside of the bag in the upper right corner. A sheet of paper will be placed in the bag along with the name of the medication, the dosage and the frequency the medication is to be dispensed. Parents are responsible for providing the Jamboree Contingent with a properly marked one-quart Zip Lock bag that will be checked in with the medications.
3. Medications will be stored in a locked box under the supervision of a Jamboree Scoutmaster. The Scoutmaster will dispense all medications to the Scouts.
4. Scouts should not be carrying their own Tylenol, ibuprofen, antacids, etc., as this should be handled like any other medication and monitored by the troop leadership. Scouts should not be taking any medications that have not been dispensed by the troop leadership or medical staff.
5. Exception: Scouts should carry their own inhalers or epi-pens/Benadryl. At the time of check-in a note from a parent is required to be given to the Assistant Scoutmaster in charge of medications with instructions on use of the inhalers or epi-pens or Benadryl.
